




As mentioned previously, today is "Curly Bill" Day. Curly Bill, at least in the movies, wore a red shirt. Because it is a little cool out you can't really tell, but most of us are wearing red bib shirts. Curly Bill was shot and killed by Wyatt Earp in a place called Cottonwood Springs. For many years, since this area went by several names, it was not known exactly where the shootout took place. Near the end of his life Wyatt Earp described the area, and the event. His description, along with other accounts, made note of a line shack near the spring. A few years ago this foundation was discovered near Cottonwood Springs. The first foundation is a stock shed, someplace to put the horses while staying at the shack. The second foundation is the actual line shack. The Vendetta riders approached the springs from the hill pictured below. Wyatt and another rider saw Curly Bill and his followers in the ravine and Wyatt charged Curly Bill and killed him. Wyatt was hit in the boot heel and his saddle horn and there were several holes in his coat but none hit him because his coat was flapping open as he charged down the hill. The owner of the property was riding with us. He is giving permission ONLY to GAA to ride here.









We ate lunch at Cottonwood Springs
































Choctaw Sessums & The Mrs.

Sweetie & Blondie. Sweetie informed me that her sister just moved to Dousman.






Bruce Boxleitner signing a poster for me.




Rob Word signing the same movie poster.
