


Episode IV: Far View Communities and Dinner

Mesa Verde's industrious Ancestral Puebloans designed, constructed, and maintained Morefield, Box Elder, Far View, and Sagebrush Reservoirs for comestic water-storage between A.D. 750 and 1180.

The photo below is a little hard to see, but there is a large walled in circle, must be 75 yards across, that was built as a reservoir. The Ancient Puebloans then dug a series of canals to feed water to the reservoir and again to their crops.
