

# DOBBY SILICONE FIGURE


FILM: Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows: Part 1 (2010)

When the cameras rolled, Dobby was played by a green tennis ball on a pole, which was ultimately replaced with a computer generated version of Dobby created by the Visual Effects Department.

Although this spider bears a striking resemblance to Aragog, it is, in fact, much smaller. Spiders like this one were created to fill the background of the Forbidden Forest scene in Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets or were attached to Ron's car as he sped away out of the forest.








Most of *Friends* was filmed here in Stage 24

# CASABLANCA (1942)


### DIRECTED BY MICHAEL CURTIZ

Released during the height of World War II, just as the Allied invasion of North Africa and the capture of the title city occurred, this romantic drama was a solid success in its initial release. Its popularity has only grown over time due to great acting, gorgeous cinematography, and an unforgettable song ("As Time Goes By"). Quotable dialogue has kept CASABLANCA alive in popular culture for generations with lines such as "Here's looking at you, kid," and "We'll always have Paris". 75 years later, this Academy Award winning Best Picture, chosen by the American Film Institute as the "Most Romantic Film of All Time," remains fresh, relevant and beloved by moviegoers around the world.



I guess a dial got switched on the camera and I didn't notice, sorry. I'm sure they had more than one pair of glasses for Harry.


