


The Wrap Party was held at Steve & Marcie's house near Albaquerque






I know those good guys pretty well. They misfired on purpose so that we had to do a second take.









Steve wrote several famous scenes from westerns into the script. Above is the Kevin Costner scene from *Silverado*.

Indy and Desert Gator, with live rounds loaded, prepare to fire back at the good guys.




Aaron always has his fingers in his ears.

Below - Celebration cake.












These two ladies and I have a special relationship. But you will have to watch the movie to find out what it is.







As you can see below, the "Boots" are ready to be awarded.







Everyone received a "Boot" as well as a personal photo. Mine is at the end.

Jane, I bet you just can't wait to get your scissors into that mop of hair. See you on the 26th.












Some actors had already left when we remembered to have the traditional end-ofride shot. But that's ok. We had theirs FOR them.






