This one makes me think of the vast plains starting their rise to the foothills and then peaks of the Rockies.






VISITOR CENTER

This is Balancing Rock. Hard to get a photo without someone climbing on it.


That gap was not a whole lot wider than my truck, and the gap coming back was even more narrow.

A real B-52 Bomber






All right, I just had to snap it. Sports Authority Field, Home of the Super Bowl Champion Denver Broncos.....Boooo!
